WHO & WHAT'S NEW FOR 2014

<u>Happy Anniversary:</u> Park City Mountain Resort turns 50 this year. Grand Targhee is 45 years old and Big Sky Resort, conceptualized by NBC newscaster, Chet Huntley, celebrates it's 40th anniversary this season. Internationally, Mount Tremblant, in Quebec turns 75 and Marmot Basin, in Alberta, turns 50. Happy birthday, everyone.

Taos Ski Valley Purchased: The founding Blake family has sold *Taos Ski Valley* to a conservationist based in New York City. Taos was the last of New Mexico's founding-family-owned resorts to be sold. Immediately following the announcement, Taos released news of the first new terrain expansion and lift projects for the 2014-2015 season, which will increase the mountain's advanced and expert lift-service terrain by 50%. The Kachina Peak area, with a summit at 12,450 feet, will be lift-accessed for the first time ever. The area was previously accessible only by hiking up. It provides superb scenic views.

2014 Ski and Snowboard Hall of Fame Inductees: Six athletes and sport builders have been elected to the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Hall of Fame for their contributions to the sport. Honorees include big mountain skier *Scot Schmidt*, freestyle pioneer and world champion *John Clendenin*, 2006 Olympic moguls bronze medalist *Toby Dawson*, freestyle aerials champion *Kris Feddersen*, globally acclaimed ski film producer *Joe Jay Jalbert* (Far West Warren Miller Award Recipient in 2005), and ski show pioneer *Jerry Simon* (Far West Snow Sports Builder Award Recipient in 2008). The six will be formally inducted into the Hall of Fame at a ceremony to be held in Park City, Utah on Saturday, April 5.

<u>Far West Race Championships:</u> The Far West Race Championships are coming up the weekend of April 4-6, 2014 at Mammoth Mountain. The price is just \$69 for the races, which include the Pace Setters Race and Clinic on Friday, April 4th, the Slalom Race on Saturday, and the Giant Slalom on Sunday. HELI-SKIING GUIDE CAUGHT IN AVALANCHE

A 31-year-old Bend, Oregon native heli-ski guide, Aaron Karitis, was buried in an avalanche on Saturday, March 15, in an Alaskan back country area known as Kicking Horse Valley.

Aaron was a very experienced heli-ski guide with *Southeast Alaska Backcountry Skiing Adventure (SEABA)* and was flown up 4,000 feet on the mountain with four clients to ski down. He was finishing his condition-check precautions when the slide was triggered. His four clients and fellow guides were not caught in the avalanche and were able to rescue him because he was wearing a locator beacon. Aaron was buried under 7 feet of snow for about twenty minutes and was unconscious when found. Unfortunately, Aaron passed away on March 17th from his injuries. He was to have been one of our guest speakers at this year's convention. For anyone lucky enough to meet this incredible young man, he was truly a shining star.

This avalanche followed one, 30 feet deep, which hit the High Campbell chairlift, the highest of 10 chairlifts, at Crystal Mountain Resort on Mount Rainier, Washington on March 11. The avalanche was intentionally triggered by the Ski Patrol, who threw a 40-pound explosive on unstable snow as a safety precaution on a slope known as "The Throne" in the High Campbell basin. "That got a bigger result than any of us anticipated" stated Tiana Enger, Crystal Mountain's marketing director. It brought down more snow than expected and wiped out a chairlift. Luckily, no one was injured. The area had been closed, and the explosion was set off at 4:45 p.m. Monday after the resort had closed. However, the slide knocked the lower terminal off its foundation and toppled one of about 10 towers.

This is the time of the year that the snow is softening, and we ALL need to be more careful and aware of where we are skiing. Be safe out there, when you're enjoying your Spring Skiing!
