**Women's Ski Jumping Names New Executive Director:** Women's Ski Jumping USA has hired *Melissa Brooke* as the foundation's new Executive Director. Brooke, of Park City, Utah, will support the top-ranked Visa Women's Ski Jumping Team and the new Fly Girls Athlete Development Program as the foundation continues to grow and flourish, thanks to the success and debut of women's ski jumping in the Olympic Winter Games.

**Julia Mancuso Presented FWSA President Award:** *Julia Mancuso*, the most decorated American Olympic female alpine skier, was presented with the Far West President's award at this year's Far West Ski Association Convention in Bend, Oregon. "Super-Jules" – as she is called by her teammates – has an on-snow resume boasting five World Cup wins, four World Championship podium finishes and three Olympic medals, including a gold in the giant slalom at the 2006 games in Turin, Italy. **USSA Athletes Win Three ESPY Awards:** The U.S. Ski and Snowboard Association Snowboard Slopestyle medalists *Jamie Anderson* and *Sage Kotsenburg*, have won three 2014 ESPY Awards. Jamie was named Best Female Action Sports Athlete and Best Female U.S. Olympian. Sage was chosen as Best Male U.S. Olympian. USSA was the most represented sports organization at the Awards, with nine Olympic athletes nominated in five categories. Other nominees included Sochi Olympians: *Mikaela Shiffrin*, *David Wise*, *Maddie Bowman*, *Kelly Clark*, *Kaitlyn Farrington*, *Joss Christensen* and *Ted Ligety*. **Snow Country's Best Mountain Resort Bike Parks:** Throughout the summer, many ski areas turn their resorts, hills and chair lifts into bike parks, offering up miles of downhill riding for all levels of mountain bikers. These bike parks create long, steep, bumpy rides found on the typical trail in most mountain biking parks. Riders can scream straight downhill, like an alpine racer, while negotiating twists and turns, rocks and stumps on the way. For the more mellow bikers, parks cut long, slow-swinging novice runs, similar to the green runs of the winter. Some of the parks recommended by Snow Country include: *Angel Fire*, *Crested Butte*, *Winter Park*, *Whistler*, *Northstar*, *Deer Valley* and *Sunday River*.

One of their goals is to at least match the \$13,000 awarded to our Junior Athletes in 2014 through the Athletic Scholarship Program. They hope to provide further grants for the rehabilitation of wounded servicemen and women, through snowsports and adaptive skiing, and they look to donate funds to the *US Women's Ski Jumping Team*.

The WSJ team will be in a rebuild phase through the 2018 Olympics. The Foundation will be looking to support them where they can. FWSF has a jumping suit that was awarded to them last year, and they hope to auction that off through various means this Fall, with the proceeds going to USWSJ.

Other goals include building a new and innovative web and seeking a better social media presence. Lastly, plans are being made to celebrate Far West Ski Association's 85th birthday and the 50th Anniversary of the Ski Foundation in the coming year.
