Timberline Lodge Receives Honor

Not only did Timberline Lodge, on Mt. Hood, Oregon, turn 75 years old this year, the National Trust for Historic Preservation has accepted them onto the list of Historic Hotels of America. Rich in history and architectural beauty, Timberline Lodge was built during the depression of the 1930s as part of the Works Progress Administration's "make-work program". The lodge received National Historic Landmark recognition in 1977. It attracts more than two million visitors annually. You can ski Timberline Ski Area 10 months a year, and their Palmer Glacier is the training ground for many Olympic and future Olympic skiers and riders each summer.

DESCRIPTION: The Far West Western Ski Heritage program annually recognizes the best effort in the prior year that communicates the contributions of snowsports to the community at large. The purpose of the Far West Western Ski Heritage program is to raise the

awareness of snowsports participants and non-participants alike of the contributions made by individuals, groups and companies to all aspects of snowsports – competitive as well as that of outdoor winter recreation and fitness. A parallel purpose is to convey the positive role snowsports has had in its contributions to the communities in the West. It recognizes outstanding effort in the area of snowsports history to find, preserve, document and share the history of snowsports in the West. The Award is open to an individual or a group leader (it is not restricted to Far West membership) and can be self-nominated or nominated by a club or club member. Materials and history programs will be evaluated against the objectives of the program by individuals selected for their knowledge of the history of Western snowsports and that of the Association. DESCRIPTION: The FWSA launched the Historical Recognition Program in 2008 to develop club, league and council histories. The objective of the annual program is to capture important information about skiing from the skier's perspective and especially that of the club skier. Selection for the award is based on digital (preferable) or mailed presentation of club or council history according to a set of weighted criteria and judged by knowledgeable ski historians.

The History Recognition is not for outstanding club or council, although it is anticipated that material may be common to both types of presentations. 2013— A Great Season

The Consensus is 2013 has been a good season

Reports from around the US and Europe claim that the 2012/2013 season has been a success and a definite improvement over last season. Flash back to the end of March 2012, with records temps in the 70s, and even 80s, there were only about a dozen ski areas still open. This year, there are four times that, and snow is still coming down in some

parts of the country. Springtime weather patterns will remain in place in the Pacific Northwest, so some of the ski areas are planning to stay open into June and possibly July. Pack your windbreaker, slather on the sunscreen, and break out the sun shades. It's time to do some Sun Skiing.

Jackson Hole and Whitefish Break Records:

Attendance records were at an all-time high for Jackson Hole Mountain Resort this year. The end of season total was approximately 502,000 skier/rider visits. This surpasses the previous record set during the winter of 2008, a winter which saw significantly more snowfall as this year. Whitefish Mountain Resort recorded a record 323,000 skier/rider visits, its' highest in the 65-year history of the mountain. Only 2 other times has the attendance been more than 300,000 in one season.

Get the Best Deal on 2014 Passes Now

For decades, lift tickets and season pass pricing followed a very simple and crude method – raise the price every single year, whether demand was rising or falling. In recent years, there has been a paradigm shift in the ski industry to pre-sell discounted (sometimes heavily discounted) season passes and lift tickets a year ahead of time. Part of the reason is better marketing, while a larger part is savvier buyers who are used to getting better pricing through the Internet within set timeframes.

With all of the new joint passes being offered, from Vail's Epic Pass to the Rocky Mountain Super Pass, to the Ski Salt Lake Super Pass, to the Mountain Collective, which is actually a bundle of 12 tickets good for 2 days at each partnered area, season pass offers can be found at some screaming-deal prices right now. Check on line for your favorite area and get your 2014 pass now.
