

David Krupp Athletic Scholarship Chair

The Far West Ski Association Athletic Scholarship Program is entering its 18th year, growing from an initial \$1,500 in scholarships in 2004 to \$12,150 and 18 recipients in the 2020-2021 season. The total awarded since the program's inception is now \$165,000 to 116 recipients.

The program is designed to provide financial assistance to junior ski racers throughout the western United States where FWSA has a presence. Applicants must be junior alpine ski racers affiliated with the United States Ski and Snowboard Association (USSA) and must participate in racing programs in states where FWSA has regional councils. These include California, Oregon, Washington, Nevada, Arizona, Idaho, Utah, and Wyoming. Scholarships are awarded based on financial need, athletic performance, academic achievement, and community service.

Skiing is an expensive sport and the costs involved in ski racing cannot be left up to the parents alone to incur. For younger athletes, the costs are modest. However, for 16 through 20-year-olds, where competition becomes national and even international, the costs can be significant. Without the

help of outside resources, many junior racers simply cannot compete. For a top competitor, expenses can reach \$20,000 per year. This is not a seasonal sport for these racers; it includes a full year of ski-related involvement. After the winter race competition has concluded, competitors engage in dryland training, then off to summer camps. Camps typically run about \$1,200 per week, not including transportation.

Winter training costs range from \$1,000-\$1,500 each season. Most applicants work part time to offset expenses. The demand on their time is significant. They must balance their time between training, competition, school, work, and community service. Despite these demands, the average GPA for these recipients consistently exceeds a 3.9 average. Our scholarships are modest compared to the need, but they do make a difference in the overall scope of the resources they require.

The funding of the scholarships come from several sources: raffles, auctions, club and council partnerships, and direct contributions from club members, clubs, and councils. The FWSA has

greatly benefitted from the generous support from its sponsors including Whitefish Mountain Resort (www.skiwhitefish.com), a year round winter and summer resort: Averill Hospitality, a premier choice in mountain resort accommodations: Grouse Mountain Lodge in Whitefish, Montana; Schure Sports, Inc. (www.karbonmail.com), maker of the Karbon line of snowsports apparel; the US Ski Team, and the Far West Racing Association. Their contributions of vacation packages, snowsports apparel, and cash bring in approximately \$10,000 per year as raffle and auction proceeds, as well as direct cash donations.

In addition, our partnership program through clubs and councils affords us approximately one third of our scholarship funding each year. Finally, the Far West Ski Foundation

(www.farwestskifoundation.org), a 501 (c)(3) non-profit organization, is a valuable resource for encouraging tax exempt donations. For more information on the Far West Athletic Scholarship Program, please visit www.fwsa.org.

Work with your club or council and your local ski area to develop or improve your ski area's "Sustainable"

Slopes" program. This program was adopted by the ski industry in 2000. It provides an overarching framework for ski areas on sustainability and enhanced environmental performance.

John Watson History Report

Our History program started in the early 2000s when we recognized we had a 75th birthday coming up in 2005. There had always been members who could speak of people, incidents, and times past. President Mike Sanford took the initiative to formalize an added committee concerned with our skiing history and he recruited several members to lead it off, including Catherine Ohl, Chuck Morse, and me (there were and are many others who have gems to share). Mike later captured a sponsor for one piece of the program in 2004 – Steamboat.

Why have a history program? There are several threads. First, to expose or educate members to the dynamic history of their sport. Second, to provide educational material for public use. Third, to promote the establishment, growth, and continuance of preservation in learning centers and museums. Fourth, to provide opportunities for research into snowsport history.

We started with the Ski Club/Council Recognition (there was objection to calling it an award) patterned after the outstanding club competition. We laid out a detailed template for guidance on what could be in such a history.

The competing entries would be judged by an expert panel. Criteria include support activity in the public community (also a criterion in the Athletic Scholarship awards). Such histories show the pace of Association development (within the larger universe of ski industry development), inform members – and conceivably (the dream of Bill Berry) be patched together into a broader history. It can be used for outreach and recruiting.

The amount of work that must go into a substantial history discouraged participation and caused us to create a recognition other than the original. So, we started the Historic Ski Club program for clubs who could prove operation for 50 years or more. This is a Recognition with a small r. Note that this now means formation before and operation since 1971. Just provide the History Chair an application available on www.fwsa.org, your proof of founding date and a good hi-res color logo. The HSC program proves the enduring attraction of clubs and the need for them to provide a basic information center at the grass roots. Clubs started in North America in 1861 with the Alturas Snowshoe Club (could also be considered a league) but the longest operating clubs are the

Cascade Ski Club of Portland and the Yosemite Winter Club, both in 1928. We know though that there were exercise clubs in Seattle in 1930 who may have had skiing as part of their programs. There is even the collaboration between clubs there that could be proto-council.

The Western Ski Heritage started as an award and then became a prize based on the Steamboat sponsorship. Steamboat is an historic odyssey. It was designed to recognize recent work which designed to show the role of snowsport in the larger community. We have recognized many authors and research projects, all shown on www.fwsa.org.

There is still work to be done in the preservation of Association records and the trends that could be gained from them. If you read through our new 90th history and fact book, you will see several possible historic sketches that need authors. Using the Secretary's minutes and reports from councils and committee chairmen, an annual narrative could be written. All good for recruiting.



Far West Ski Foundation

The Foundation remains the sister fund raising organization for the Association. And the targets for September through December need your planning attention NOW.

You can designate your contribution or make it unrestricted and aimed where most needed, or designate it toward one of the following missions.

- Scholarships for young (U20) ski racers
- Supportive grants, including scholarships to adaptive skiing schools.
- Supportive education and preservation grants to museums and projects concerning history of snowsport.
- Supportive grants to Womens' Ski Jumping USA (now a part of USA Nordic)
- Incidental grants to eligible organizations that support snowsport.

Traditional support from partners and sponsors enabled the Foundation to make scholarship grants despite the pandemic. Unfortunately, we have little or no backup for adaptive ski schools or museums and education. So, we do seek your help as individuals or from your organizations for these purposes.

We have about 30 adaptive ski schools and a half dozen museum type organizations and facilities in FWSA territory. There is always the possibility of a worthy snowsport research project as well. We need to play catch up in all of our objectives.

The best way to do this is through your PayPal account or by sending a check to the FWSF Treasurer John Reinhardt. If you use PayPal, send to Far West Ski Foundation and no fees are charged. If by check, send to John O Reinhardt, Treasurer FWSF, 6105 SW Sheridan Street, Portland, Oregon 97225. Don't forget to make your check out to FWSF.

On other matters, the Foundation will elect a new President and other officers and elect some new trustees by the time of the October convention of the Association. Meanwhile, we are looking to expand our sources of revenue to include industry and major donors and to expand our objectives in snowsport.

Jennifer Coutts Intermountain Ski Council



The Intermountain Ski Council (ISC) has come a long way from summer 2020 when it nearly disbanded to where it is now: meeting regularly with a functional board, new website and social media pages and we are currently planning a get-together in Lava Hot Springs, ID for the first weekend in August. The by-laws have been reviewed and amended for the first time since 2008 and we have also agreed to host the 2023 FWSA convention in Boise, ID. As with all councils, the COVID-19 pandemic halted a lot of activity and some of the earlier efforts to revive itself but now the future of the ISC is looking brighter with each passing month. We are thankful for the folks within the FWSA and the clubs of ISC who have been helping to make that happen! The ISC serves ski clubs in Utah, Idaho, Wyoming, S. The Cheyenne Ski Club in Wyoming found clever and fun

ways to stay active during the uncertainty of the past year. They organized backcountry outings, charitable giving opportunities, a socially-distanced Christmas cookie exchange and Zoom learning sessions on things like tuning skis and reading terrain. This club is also one of FWSA's designated historic ski clubs and has been moving and grooving since 1959.



The club leaders and regional board of the NBS Western Region recognized April 24, 2021 as "Haymon T. Jahi Leadership Excellence Day" in memoriam of Haymon Jahi, a former national NBS President, NBS Western Region Vice President, NBS Western Region Director, and President of Fire & Ice Ski Club of San Jose, CA who passed due to complications caused by COVID-19 following the NBS Black

Summit in Sun Valley, Idaho in March 2020.

On May 1, 2021, the NBS Western Region hosted a Zoom workshop on "Facebook for Snowsports Clubs" that was moderated by the Northwest Ski Club Council Social Media Chair and FWSA Woman of the Year, Becki Robinson. We will not solve the problems of the world, but the Far West Ski Association hopes to positively impact our small section of it.


Racing didn't happen for us this season, although some of our racers participated in masters race training programs operated at some Tahoe resorts.
